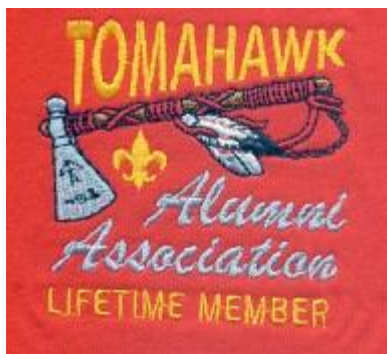




Keep The Association Strong: Become a TAA Member

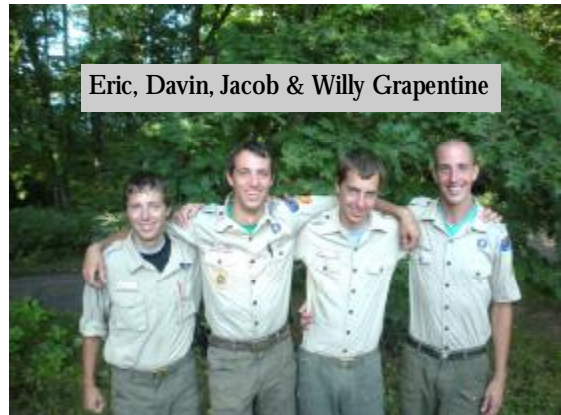

Four Brothers Footsteps: One Large Imprint At Tomahawk

Meet the Grapentine boys, Davin, Eric, Willy, and Jacob. Combined they have a total of 32 years of experience on the Tomahawk camp staff. All four brothers are Eagle Scouts and great camp staff members. Over the summer I reflected on the pairs of siblings we had working on Tomahawk staff and realized what a unique situation it is to have all four brothers working on staff at the same time. I decided to interview each brother.

Who influenced your scouting path?

The Grapentine's interest in Scouting was influenced by their father David who was the Scoutmaster of Troop 212 in Maple Wisconsin. David and their mother Jane impressed upon the boys the importance of the outdoors and spent much of their time participating in outdoor activities as a family. By the time the boys were old enough to be Scouts they were well versed in hiking, exploring, canoeing, and ecology. The boys all camped in Sioux camp and after Davin, the eldest brother, decided to become a Counselor in Training the rest followed suite and have worked on staff ever since.



What were your positions?

Davin: Age 27, has worked on the Tomahawk staff for 13 consecutive summers in a variety of jobs including junior staff counselor, aquatics director, Sioux camp director, and most recently as Associate Reservation Director.

Eric: Age 24, has worked at Tomahawk for 10 seasons. Like Davin, Eric is also a big fan of the beach. He has been the Sioux beach director for the past three summers and worked as a beach instructor before that. Eric also worked in Chippewa as a commissioner and in ecology.

Willy: Age 22, has been a member of the Tomahawk staff for 6 seasons. Willy began his Tomahawk career working at Navajo beach then transitioned to working at Sioux beach for four seasons and most recently served as an instructor at Navajo beach.

Jacob: Age 18, is the youngest of the Grapentine boys. Jacob was a counselor in training and has worked as a staff member for three seasons. Jacob worked at Navajo beach his first season then worked at Sioux beach the following two seasons.

What motivates you to continue working at Tomahawk?

Davin: He likes the creative freedom to be able to develop programs and have a positive impact on Scouts attending camp. Davin said he enjoys learning a variety of skills that camp teaches, he gets to work with the best people you will find anywhere, and camp is the best job he or anyone could ever have.

Eric: Eric enjoys working outdoors, building the skills of Scouts, training and developing his staff members, and being able to tackle new challenges each day.

Willy: Willy, who almost always has a broad smile across his face, said he most enjoys making sure the Scouts have a good experience at camp. He likes working with younger staff members to develop their aquatics and leadership skills and enjoys teaching Scouts skills that they are learning for the first time.

Jacob: Jacob enjoys being a positive role model for the Scouts and making great friends with fellow Tomahawk staffers. Jacob is excited to continue working at Tomahawk for many seasons to come.

What is your fondest memory?

Davin: Best memory at camp was the first time he came to Tomahawk. Everything was exciting and fun and by the time he completed his swim test at the beach and met the lifeguard staff he knew he wanted to work at camp.

Eric: Best memory at Tomahawk was the first time he met a staff member named Marshall Lichty. Eric said Marshall loud and fun and made all the Scouts around him have a great time. Eric new after meeting Marshall that someday he would want to become a staff member at Tomahawk.

Willy: Best memory was camping at Tomahawk with his troop. He enjoyed getting out in camp and participating in as many activities as he could, and like his brothers, favored activities at the beach.

Jacob: Best memory was taking the sailing merit badge at Sioux beach.

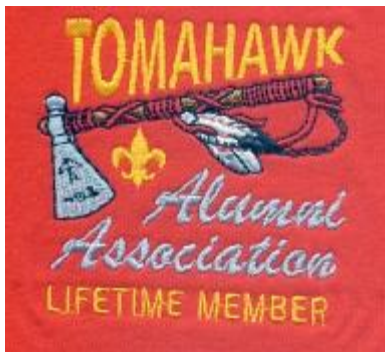

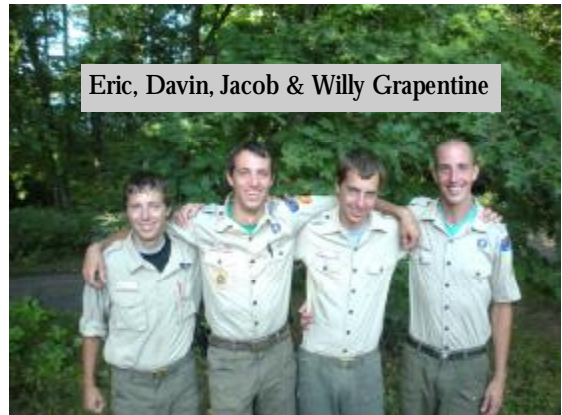
